Ray Ainsworth dies in Powell hospital

Funeral services for Ray D. Ainsworth, 78, of Greybull were held at the Seventh Day Adventist church at Big Trails by Pastor Ray Wyatt. Burial was in Tensleep. Mr. Ainsworth died July 29 in the Powell hospital. He had been in failing health for several years. He was born Sept. 16, 1888, at Mt. Pleasant, Ia., the son of Frank S. and Lula Bishop Ainsworth. All of his life, except 1 1/2 years, have been spent at Big Trails.

He was married to Edith May Broun on Oct. 3, 1912, at Big Trails. They owned and operated a ranch at Big Trails until moving to Greybull in the fall of 1961. They sold the ranch about two years ago. He was a charter member of the Big Trails Seventh Day Adventist church. Survivors are: his wife, Edith of Greybull; two sons, Harold of Pendleton, Ore., and Herbert of Worland; one daughter, Mrs. Ruby Gifford of Grand Junction, Colo.; and seven grandchildren.
