## Native Ten Sleep Resident Dies In Nursing Home

TEN SLEEP — Mrs. Gertrude May Bader, 81, pioneer and lifelong resident of the Ten Sleep area, died Monday in a Greybull nursing home following an illness of several months.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p.m. Wednesday in Ten Sleep Methodist church, with the Rev. Howard Kildow officiating. Burial will be in Ten Sleep cemetery. Veile mortuary of Worland is in charge of arrangements.

Mrs. Bader was born April 9, 1887, in Ten Sleep, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Bull. She attended Ten Sleep and Lovell schools, and was married to Merton Bader, Sr., at Ten Sleep on June 19, 1910.

The couple operated a ranch on the Nowood river four miles northwest of Ten Sleep, residing there continuously until their retirement about 15 years ago, when they moved to Ten Sleep. Mr. Bader died June 17, 1968.

Mrs. Bader was a member of the Methodist church and Friendly Circle extension club.

Surviving are six sons, Merton, Jr., Lloyd, Tom and Ben, all of Ten Sleep; Willard of Thermopolis, and Neil of Glenrock; one daughter, Mrs. Foster Miner of Vancouver, Wash. one sister, Mrs. Bessie Hodge of Kalispell, Mont.; one brother, Jim Bull of Ten Sleep, 24 grandchildren and several great-grandchildren.
