Garrison Delno (Dell) Brown was born to John R Brown and his wife Elizabeth S Carlisle in Bruce, Benton, Iowa in 1868. In 1894 he married Julia L Williams and they were the parents of a 3 year old daughter named Maria who was listed on the 1900 U.S. Census for Banner, Sheridan, WY. They were living with Dell's parents at that time. In 1910 Dell Brown was living in Hyattville, Big Horn County with a Marie having reached the age of 15[13?]. His next abode was Election District #3, Washakie County, WY. From the 1895 (Iowa)collective data census he was listed in the Agricultural business. He passed away in 1928 and was survived by his wife and his mother and preceded in death by his father John R (1927).

Other data: John R Brown and his wife Elizabeth S Brown are both buried in the Hyattville Cemetery. Dell's mother outlived both Dell and his wife Julia as she passed away in 1943.

DEL BROWN DIES AT TEN SLEEP

Delnow G. Brown, proprietor of the Brown Hotel at Ten Sleep and for more than a quarter of a century a resident of the Big Horn Basin died at his home in Ten Sleep Tuesday morning at 1:45 A. M. following a short illness.

During his residence in this county Mr. Brown at one time operated the stage line between Ten Sleep and No Wood and later was engaged in the contracting business in addition to the operation of the Brown Hotel.

Mr. Brown was born at Dysart, Iowa, December 2, 1869 where he made his home until he reached his majority. He came west and settled at Sheridan, Wyoming and later moved into the Big Horn Basin, where he has been a true friend and considerate neighbor in the community where he has lived.

In 1894 he was married to Miss Julia Lyrrell at Glendive, Montana and to this union was born one daughter, now Mrs. Marie E. Smith of Meeteetse.

He is survived by his mother, Mrs. J. R. Brown, his wife, the daughter and two sisters, Mrs. Dan Winslow of Hyattville, Wyoming and Mrs. O. G. Linniberry of Los Angeles, Calif. and three grand children.

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon at Ten Sleep where the remains were given their final resting place. Rev. Clyde Hampton officiating. He was a member of the Modern Woodmen of America at Basin and his lodge had charge of the services at the grave side.
