Services For Car Crash Victim Are Held in Ten Sleep

Funeral services for Wesley Bull, 22, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jim Bull of Worland, who was killed in an automobile crash near Worland early Sunday morning, were held in the Methodist church at Ten Sleep at 2 p. m. Tuesday.

The Rev. D. M. Kitch, pastor of the Worland and Ten Sleep Methodist churches, officiated. Pallbearers were Tuck McCreery, Elmer McCreery, Oren McCreery and George McLaughlin, all of Ten Sleep, and Arnold Wain and Brooks Egbert, both of Spring Creek.

Mrs. David Egbert, Mrs. Glen Montgomery, Mrs. Florence Shriver and Mrs. Delores McPike, accompanied by Mrs. Vernon Price, sang.

Burial was in the Ten Sleep cemetery. The Veile mortuary was in charge.

Besides his parents, Bull leaves a sister, Mrs. Goldie Jacobson of Gebo; his maternal grandmother, Mrs. Martha Wain of Ten Sleep, and several aunts, uncles and cousins.

August Haefke, 27, driver of the automobile in which Bull was killed, remained in a serious condition with a broken pelvis, several broken ribs and severe cuts and bruises at the Worland hospital last night. His condition was reported unchanged.

The Ten Sleep community was shocked to receive word of the sudden death of Wesley Bull early Sunday morning. Wesley was born at Spring creek and attended school in that district, later moving to Ten Sleep, where he entered high school and graduated in 1937. He was an outstanding football player and was well liked by his many friends and schoolmates. He loved all outdoor sports and had competed in many rodeos. He is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Jim Bull of Worland and one sister, Mrs. Goldie Jacobson of Gebo. His maternal grandmother, Mrs. Martha Wain and a maternal great aunt, Mrs. Emma Smith, both of Ten Sleep, also survive. He has aunts and uncles and many cousins living in this community. Funeral services were held in Ten Sleep Tuesday afternoon.
