

**Edson B Carothers**  
1860 - 1934

Edward Carothers passed away at his home in Ten Sleep last Saturday night after a short illness. Pneumonia being the cause of his death.

Funeral services were held at the M. E. Church in Ten Sleep on Monday afternoon, Rev. Nelson Wurgler of the Methodist Church of Basin preaching the services. A large crowd attended the funeral, showing the esteem in which Edward Carothers was held by friend and neighbor. He was a member of the Methodist Church.

Edward Carothers was born in Ohio on October 2, 1862 being the son of Robert and Martha Carothers, when four years of age his family moved to Kansas where he remained until he was sixteen years of age, then wishing to make his own way in the world he went to Colorado to seek opportunity, he rode the range for a while then went to Utah and from there, came to Wyoming in 1882 locating in Johnson county. On the plains of the Powder River for three years he rode the range and finding the life a pleasant one decided to go into the stock business for himself. He then came into the Big Horn basin taking up a homestead and made a fine ranch out of it. Living there until about six years ago, when he leased the place to his son and moved to Ten Sleep.

He was married at Hyattville, Wyoming in 1888 to Miss Jennie Hatton, a native of Ohio. Three children were born to this union John, Alvin and Edna; Alvin now lives on the home ranch on Broken Back, John makes his home in Ten Sleep while Mrs. Edna Dent lives at the McKeon ranch. He is survived by the three children and his wife.
