TEN SLEEP — Clyde C. Caudell, 72, of Ten Sleep, died Wednesday, June 26, at Washakie Memorial Hospital in Worland.

He was born Feb. 2, 1919, in Gallup, N.M., a son of Delbert and Violet Caudell. He grew up in New Mexico and Hanford, Calif. and received his education in Hanford.

He worked in-southern California doing plaster work on construction projects.

On March 10, 1940, he married

Gladys Carr in Hanford. They moved to Ten Sleep in 1977.

Mr. Caudell enjoyed hunting and collecting rocks and making jewelry with them.

Survivors include his wife of Ten Sleep; his mother, Vi of Lander; two sons, Dale C. and Daniel R., both of Riverside, Calif.; three brothers, George of Sunnymead, Calif., Robert of Newport, Wash. and Allen of Rock Springs; one sister, Maryann Mojdie of Riverton; three grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Clyde C Caudell was born 9 February 1919 in Farmington, San Juan, New Mexico to Delbert and Merle Caudell. The 1930 census shows brothers George Harry and Robert Delbert with the family and Clyde as the oldest child. His Social Security No. was assigned in California. In 1951 on December 5, he crossed the Mexican border at Brownsville, TX, PanAmerican flight. Between 1900-1968 he is listed as a machinist with the company of Claudell and Johnson and is shown in the directory with Ruby M Claudell. Clyde C and Mrs. Gladys are listed again as Republicans he a truckdriver and she a housekeeper in Richmond, CA for the California voting list precinct #7. He passed away on

26 June 1991 in Worland, WY (obits listed in Northern WYO Daily News) and was subsequently buried in Ten Sleep, WY.
