Lewis Ray Cogdill died Tuesday, Feb. 14 at the VA Hospital in Sheridan. He was 75.

Cogdill was born Jan. 3, 1914 in Worland, the son of Charles and Elsie M. (Neely) Cogdill. He lived in Worland as a boy and moved with his family to the Cogdill Ranch on the Upper Nowood south of Ten Sleep. He worked on the family-ranch for several years, then went to work as horsebreaker and later as a timberer. He also worked as a shepherd for various ranches in the area.

He had served in the U.S. Army during World War II as a veterinary technician.

On Nov. 9, 1942, he married Dorothy Cole in Thermopolis. They were later divorced.

His hobby was braiding articles for use on horses, including bridles,

reins, rawhide nosebands and r

Survivors include two sons, I John of Fairbanks, Alaska and Terry Lee of Worland; two brothers, Ronald and Harold, both of Ten Sleep; two sisters, Mrs. E (Doris) Breeden of Ten Sleep and Mrs. Elsie Bosch of Worland and grandsons, Terry James Cogdill of Worland and Josh Cogdill of Fairbanks, Alaska.
