

ALLAN (PATTY) EGBERT (1921-2012)

Former Ten Sleep resident Allan Egbert, 91, passed away on Saturday, Sept. 29, 2012 at St. Anthony Hospital in Pendleton, Ore.

Allan was born April 13, 1921 in Kaycee to John and Evaline Skinner Egbert. He graduated from Ten Sleep High School. He served in the U.S. Army in the European Theater 34th General Hospital during World War II.

On Oct. 24, 1975, he and Mary Lurana Greet married at the Village Seventh-day Adventist Church in College Place, Wash. where they worshiped.

He is remembered as a kind, loving and spiritual man who believed anything could be fixed with a little elbow grease, wire and duct tape. He loved to spend time with his family and especially his grandchildren, taking them camping, huckleberry picking, sledding, to the park, on long walks or letting them help in his garden.

He was preceded in death by two brothers; a step-daughter, Carol Schaub; and step-son Carl Jordan. Allan is survived by his wife of the family home in College Place; his step-daughter, Joy Bonar of Thermopolis; his step-son, Don Jordan of Worland; his brother, Nelson "Swede" Egbert of Spokane, Wash.; 12 grandchildren; 16 great-grandchildren; three nieces and one nephew.

The memorial service will be at 10 a.m. on Sunday, Oct. 28 in the Chapel of The Village Seventh-day Adventist Church, 12th and Larch Streets, College Place, Wash. Memorial contributions may be made to The Voice of Prophecy through Mountain View-Colonial DeWitt, 1551 Dallas Military Road, Walla Walla, Wash. 99362. Allan joined the Ten Sleep Seventh-day Adventist Church, Ten Sleep, Wyoming by baptism May 15, 1937.

Allan Egbert was born on the 13th of April 1921 to the John and Evaline Egbert family living in Kaycee, Wyoming. The family consisted of two older sons: Clifford and Emmett. Later a brother Nelson joined the family of boys. Allan enlisted in WW II as a private and was a Private First Class at discharge. Some of his life was spent in Colorado and some of it in Walla Walla, Washington. A marriage is reported of 24 October 1975, College Place, Walla Walla, to Mary Luana Jordan. He died September 29, 2012 at the age of 90 in Pendleton, Umatilla County, Oregon.

OTHER: one source indicates that Allan died on September 30, 2012; some censuses don't list Allen. I know the family was well known in the Ten Sleep area. John Egbert (also buried in T.S.) had brothers David and Brooks Egbert living nearby. I recall the family were of the Adventist faith^[1], partly through Cora Nicholson, the second wife of John Egbert; however, Evaline's funeral in 1932 is noted in the Worland newspaper as being held at the Ten Sleep Methodist Church.

Note: Mary Luana Jordan, it is believed, is the former Mary Greet from upper Nowood.

^[1] Mrs. Cora Nicholson was of the Adventist Faith and Clifford Egbert married her grand-daughter Bessie Jacobs who was of that faith.
