WORLAND - Memorial services for Worland resident Larry A. Egbert, 71, will be conducted at 2 p.m. Thursday, March 4, in Bryant Funeral Home Chapel in Worland by Bishop Jay Brown. Cremation will have taken place and burial will be at a later date in Ten Sleep Cemetery. He died Feb. 29, 2004, at Washakie Medical Center.

Born Nov. 6, 1932, in Ten Sleep, he was the son of Brooks and Eula (Waln) Egbert. He was raised and educated in the Ten Sleep area and graduated from Ten Sleep High School in 1950. He enlisted in the U.S. Air Force; was injured a short time later; and was released on a medical discharge. After returning to Ten Sleep, he then moved to Hanover, Ill., to work as a farmhand. He moved to Forsyth, Mont., and continued working on local ranches until 1960, when he went to work in the oil field.

On Sept. 2, 1960, he married Nettie Woods in Lewistown, Mont. They made their home in the Lewistown area for the next two years. The family moved several times in the following years to different parts of the country. He had the opportunity to work with a seismograph crew in Kenya, Africa, for a while and his wife and children returned to Ten Sleep.

In 1993, the couple settled in Worland. He drove a truck until retiring in 2000. His hobbies included taking care of his yard, flower-gardening, and woodworking. He was a member of the American Legion and Eagles Lodge.

Survivors include his wife of 43 years of Worland; three daughters, Barbara Hughes of Washington, D.C., and Sandra Richard and her husband and Janet Egbert, both of Worland; two grandchildren; two sisters, Marjory Woody of Riverton and Grace O'neill and her husband of Dixon, Ill.; and numerous nieces and nephews.
