TEN SLEEP — Robert M. Everett, 65, of Ten Sleep died Thursday, Feb. 27, in St. Vincent's Hospital in Billings.

He was born Aug. 13, 1926, in Scottsbluff, Neb., a son of Leonard M. and Ruth (Fox) Everett. He moved to Wyoming as a small child and grew up and received his education in Worland and Manderson.

On July 5, 1945, he married Bessie Bull in Worland.

Mr. Everett was a member of Elks Lodge No. 1906 in Worland, the Ten Sleep Fire Department, the Ten Sleep Ambulance and Resuce Service and Floyd Minch Post No. 44, American Legion, in Worland.

Survivors include his wife of Ten Sleep; two daughters, Vonda Eschrich of Laramie and Lana Brown of Sand Point, Idaho; one brother, Willard R. Everett of Basin and five grandchildren.

The service is scheduled for 2 p.m. Wednesday in the United Methodist Church in Ten Sleep, with the Rev. Richard Rash officiating. Burial will be in Ten Sleep Cemetery with military graveside honors conducted by Floyd Minch Post American Legion.

Robert (Bob) Mirven Everett was born 13 August 1926 in Mitchell, Scotts Bluff, NE to Len and Ruth¹ Everett and the family were in Scotts Bluff County until 1935. Robert had three siblings in the Everett family at that time, Wilma (9); Willard (7); and Nadine an infant. That year the family was listed as residents in both Nebraska and Wyoming and Bob was 9 years old in Manderson, WY. This leaves questions about the age of his sister Wilma at the time. He enlisted in the U.S. Army from the state of New Jersey but as a Wyoming resident February 7, 1946. . After WW II he married Bessie Blanche Bull, daughter of Frank and Mellie Bull, 5 July 1946 in Worland, Wyoming. The couple had two daughters: Vonda Everett Eshcrich (John) and Lana Everett Brown (Sand Point, ID). He died February 27, 1992 in Billings Montana preceded in death by his wife Bessie. His lifetime labors were with the Rural Electric Association, headquartered in Basin, WY.

Memories: Bob Everett was a man who minded his own affairs and let others to tend their own. He was a steady, dedicated employee of REA, a faithful husband, and a good citizen in the community. fb
