After high school he attended the University of Sioux Falls on a track scholarship. He transferred to Casper College where he went for a year and a half before transferring to the University of Wyoming. Dylan graduated from the University of Wyoming in May of 2014 with a B.S. in Education. Every summer since he was 17 he had worked for Back Country Spraying. He recently received a teaching contract with the Niobrara County School District and was set to teach Science at the Lusk High School.

Dylan was a musician and loved writing songs and riding his motorcycle.
