MRS. FITZPATRICK LAID TO REST IN TEN SLEEP MONDAY
Washakie Signal-Free - July 15, 1943

Funeral services for Mrs. Mary Catherine Fitzpatrick, 73, were held at the Adventist church in Ten Sleep Monday with the Rev. Belle Ludwig officiating. Mrs. Ludwig and Mrs. Roy Shriver sang a duet "Some Day We'll Understand," and Ann Shaner and Marjorie Dornam sang "Beyond the Sunset," and "Sweet Be Thy Rest". During the committal service Mrs. Ludwig and Mrs. Shriver sang "Someday the Silver Chord Will Break". Pallbearers were Bert Arnold, Art Claycomb, Tom Fields, Paul Frison, Lige Thaxton and Leo Rhodes.

Mrs. Fitzpatrick was born in Columbus Grove, Ohio, March 27, 1870. She moved to Ten Sleep with her son, L. L. Fitzpatrick from Sheridan about two years ago. She died Saturday at the Worland hospital where she had been a patient for about a week. Her doctor attributed death to natural causes. She is survived by her son. Two sons and her husband preceded her in death.
