Charles H. Ford

Charles H., Ford died Sunday, July 3, at the Wyoming State Sanitarium at Basin. Funeral services were at 10 a.m. Wed. in the Ten Sleep Methodist Church.

Ford was born to Charles and Lillie E. Ford on July 24, 1890, in Buffalo. His family moved to Denver, Colo., and on to Holbrook, Arizona, when he was four years old. They returned to Buffalo in 1899 and moved into

the Ten Sleep area in 1900.

Ford served in the U. S. Army in Belgium and France during World War I. He returned to Ten Sleep where he worked in turn as a sheep rancher, dairyman and cabinet maker. During World War II, he worked at the Handford, Wash. nuclear plant as a carpenter.

He married Eva Emery on June 6, 1917, at Ten Sleep. His

wife preceded him in death in 1977, as did his infant daughter in 1934. Two brothers also preceded him in death.

Two sisters, Jean Morton of Ojai, Calif., and Nell Price of Eugene, Ore., survive Ford.

Burial will be at the Ten Sleep Cemetery with the Ten Sleep Masonic Lodge providing graveside Masonic Rites.
