Maurine Elizabeth Nelson was born March 23, 1911, at Hyattville, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Willis Nelson.

She died early Monday while enroute to Billings for medical attention.

Maurine spent her early childhood in Hyattville where she started to grade school. In about 1920, the family moved to Idaho and spent several years there. After returning to the Hyattville area, Maurine attended high school in Basin and summer school in Laramie so she could qualify to become a teacher. Her first teaching job was at school on the Nowood river about eight miles east of Manderson.

Following this, she attended summer schools in Laramie and in California during the summer months and maintained her teaching job during the school term.

In 1932, she moved to Ten Sleep and became a teacher in the Ten Sleep schools.

In 1935, she became the bride of David Theodore Frison. The next 27 years were spent on the ranch at Ten Sleep. The couple had six children.

Survivors include her husband; her children, Mrs. Margaret Inez Harless of Basin; Jean Marie and Willis Charles, both students at the University of Wyoming; David James of Worland, and Daniel Thomas and Patrick Shields, both of Ten Sleep; her mother, Mrs. Inez Nelson of Basin; a sister, Mrs. Oscar Barnes of Laramie; two grandchildren and several cousins, aunts and uncles. One brother and her father preceded her in death.
