Mrs. Paul Frison Laid to Rest Tues.

Mrs. Paul Frison, who recently underwent an operation in a Basin hospital passed away Sunday after it was believed the danger point was past. Mrs. Frison was a Washakie County girl having grown to young womanhood in the Ten Sleep vicinity, where a large number of friends remain to regret her passing.

Funeral services were held in Ten Sleep Tuesday afternoon, Rev. Jno. Frank Smith officiating and interment was made in the Ten Sleep Cemetery.

A quartet consisting of Mr. and Mrs. E. T. Ferry, Mrs. Charles H. Harkins, and A. G. Johnson accompanied by Mrs. R. C. Shultz at the piano contributed appropriate music, while Miss Bertha Faure accompanied by Miss Willis Ferry sang "The City Four Square."

Mable Ella Emery was born October 1st, 1893 at Elroy, Wisconsin, the daughter of Burdette and Mellie Emery. She moved with her parents to Wyoming in 1897, and grew to womanhood in this community.

She was united in marriage to Paul Frison on June 4, 1919. Unto this union was born two children, Marcella, Age 9, and Jerald, age 6.

She died February 22, in Basin, Wyoming, following a double operation and internal hemorrhage.
