Kay Ellsworth Goodrich was born 23 December 1927 to Jake and Blanche Jones (Sis) Goodrich in Ten Sleep, WY. He was schooled there until about 1943 when the Goodrich family moved to Buffalo Johnson County, WY. He was their first born and had five siblings: Wanda, Audrey, Jacob Hal, Mona Marie and Carol. During WW II, he served in the U.S. Navy and fulfilled his patriotic duty. After his military service, Kay found himself doing the same thing his father did sawmilling and other sundry things to make a living. He married Angeline Potter and the couple had 5 children: Bob, Larry, Jim, Hazel, and Diana. Kay later remarried Benita Cash Goodrich with no children to this union.

LANDER — Kay E. Goodrich, 65, of Lander, formerly of Ten Sleep, died Wednesday, March 24, in the VA Medical Center in Sheridan.

He was born Dec. 23, 1927, in Ten Sleep, a son of Jacob and Eva Goodrich. He was raised and attended school in Ten Sleep.

During World War II, he served in the U.S. Navy.

He worked in the timber industry all his life. He worked as a timberman in the Big Horn and Wind River mountains. He owned and operated sawmills and sawed ties for Wyoming Tie and Timber Co. He also worked in sawmills in the Pacific Northwest and ranched and trucked in the Big Horn Basin.

On Feb. 13, 1976, he married Bernetta Cachelin in Paris, Idaho and they settled in Lander.

Mr. Goodrich was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints.

Survivors include his wife of Lander; three sons, Bob of Riverton, Larry of Lander and Jim of Malad, Idaho; three stepsons, Marvin Cachelin and Terry Cachelin of Lander and David Cachelin of Canada; two daughters, Hazel Farrar of Riverton and Dianne DeWitt of Pocatello, Idaho; three stepdaughters, Cindy Deshaw and Karen Good of Lander and Linda Southerland of Thermopolis; one brother, Hal Goodrich of Livingston, Mont.; three sisters, Wanda Fernikas of Rock Springs, Audrey Million of Yuma, Ariz. and Carol Pehringer of

Sheridan; 22 grandchildren and five great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by one sister and one daughter.
