



**Fred and Dora Greet**

**Dora Wallen Greet  
1889-1979**

Dora Wallen was born at Portland, N.D. Nov. 8, 1889 to Belle Pederson and Erick O. Wallen. Her elementary and High School education as in Wisconsin; University of South Dakota; and summer school at University of Minnesota and Miller Hospital at St. Paul where she had training as a hospital laboratory technician. Both families operated the ranch until 1949 when the Fred Greets moved to 'Worland, where they still reside. Mr. and Mrs. Frank Greet moved to Ten Sleep where they are now living. The ranch is presently run by Frank's three sons.

Mr. Greet is a long time member of the Wyoming Stockgrowers Association, and his wife if a member of the women's auxiliary, the Cowbells. Mr. and Mrs. Greet are charter members of the Washakie County Chapter of the Wyoming Historical Society.

## Dora W. Greet

Dora W. Greet, 89, died July 13 at Bethesda Care Center.

Mrs. Greet was born Nov. 8, 1889 at Portland, N.D. the daughter of Erick O. and Belle E. Wallen. She moved to Casper to teach school where she met Fred Greet. The couple was married on June 18, 1929 at Casper.

Following their marriage, she moved to the Big Trails area where she and her husband ranched until retiring in 1950. They then moved to Worland where she has resided until her death.

She was a member of the W.G.T.U., Washakie County Historical Society, Cowbelles and Seventh Day Adventist Church. She was also active in the local Republican party at one time.

Her husband preceded her in death. She is survived by three sisters, Ella B. Huffman of Mohall, N.D., Sara Wallen and Mrs. Edna Davis of San Bernardino, Calif.; five nephews,

George and John Greet of Ten Sleep, Neal Greet of Worland, James Greet of College Place, Wash. and Warren Wallen of Iowa City, Iowa; three nieces, Mrs. Ernest Vick of Brookings, S.D., Mrs. Arthur (Marjorie) Smith of Ten Sleep and Mrs. Allen (Mary) Egbert of College Place, Wash.
