The body was shipped to the family home at Hyattville for burial.

Later her mother married Mr. Smith and the family have since resided on their ranch about 8 miles south of Hyattville. She grew up here and was known and loved by everybody. She leaves her husband and little daughter, mother, two sisters, four brothers and many, many friends to mourn her loss.
