

**Frank (Jack) Harold**  
1882 - 1967

**Area Pioneer  
Dies at 84** *Apr 2 1967*

Frank (Jack) Harold, 84, early-day resident of the Basin and Ten Sleep areas, died Sunday morning in a Riverton nursing home.

Mr. Harold was born Aug. 9, 1882, in Nevada, Mo., the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charley Harold. He later moved to Indiana for 2½ years, then returned to Basin. In 1907, he moved to Lander.

He returned to Ten Sleep in 1908 and lived at Big Trails, where he owned a ranch. In 1942 he moved to California, and was engaged in government service as maintenance superintendent in charge of the carpented division at Travis Air Force base.

He retired from government service in 1957 and returned to Ten Sleep in 1961 where he had resided since.

He was preceded in death by his wife on April 30, 1963, and two daughters.

Survivors include three daughters, Mrs. Roy (Florence) Shriver of Ten Sleep, Mrs. Ed (Agnes) Temple of Sheridan and Mrs. George (Alma) Ybst of Sacramento, Calif.; one son, Charley, of Riverton; seven grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren.

Survivors include his wife and two children, Kyle and Kristi; his parents of Worland; a sister, Mrs. Robert King of Bellingham, Wash., and his maternal grandmother, Mrs. David Agualo of Lodi, Calif.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p.m. Tuesday in the Ten Sleep Methodist church, with the Rev. Howard Kildow officiating. Mrs. Howard Standefer will be vocalist. Burial will be in Ten Sleep cemetery, with Veile mortuary of Worland in charge of arrangements.
