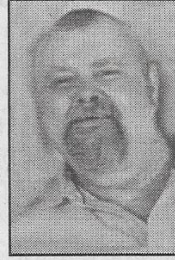


Edward E. Harris

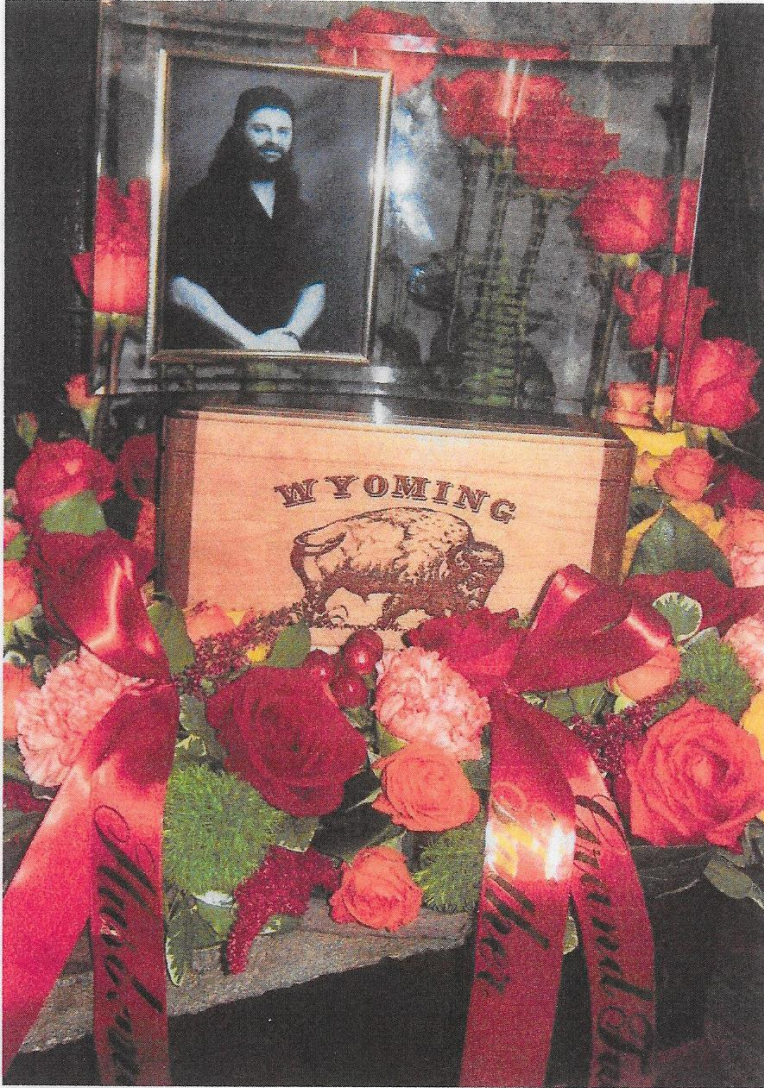
Services will be held May 24, 2014 at 11:00am, at Mountain View Baptist Church with Buddy Hansen officiating.
