Mrs. Helms, whose maiden name was Anna Christina Bennetson, was born near Copenhagen, Denmark, Jan. 11, 1892 and departed this life at the Worland hospital, Worland, Wyo., July 10, 1942 at the age of 50 years, five months and 29 days. She was a member of the Lutheran church in Denmark.

In 1912 she emigrated to America. She lived for two years at Brand Island, Neb., and then moved to the Nowood country. On August 21, 1916 she was married to Virgil Helms at Basin. To this union was born one daughter, Eda, who is now Mrs. George Van Gaalen.

Besides her husband and daughter, Mrs. Helms is survived by a brother, Ben, of Washington, and her mother and other brothers and sisters in Denmark if they have survived the war.
