PHOENIX — Claude Randall Hillhouse, formerly of Worland, died of accidental carbon monoxide poisoning Thursday, June 7 in Phoenix. He was 42.

He was born July 27, 1947 in Rocky Mount, N.C., a son of Charles N. "Chick" and Phyllis (Prevo) Hillhouse. He was raised in Worland and graduated from Worland High School in 1965. During high school, he was active in wrestling and was a cheerleader/acrobat.

He attended the University of Wyoming for three years, majoring in art. Following college, he worked for McGarvin-Moberly Construction, then worked as the Worland school district warehouseman for several years. He moved to Buffalo and worked for Radio KBBS before moving to Phoenix in 1986. He worked for Graphics, Inc. and was attending the Phoenix Institute of Technology, majoring in commercial art, at the time of his death.

In 1974, he married Gloria Franco in Worland. They were later divorced and he married DeVonne Myers in

the Big Horn Mountains. They were later divorced.

He enjoyed bass music and had played bass guitar with Sal and The Sons of Sound for several years. He was an artist and painted the Warrior logo on the Worland football stadium. He enjoyed the outdoors, swimming and diving.

Survivors include his parents, C.N. "Chick" and Audrey Hillhouse of Phoenix and Phyllis and John Strong of Hyattville; three sons, Richard, of Phoenix and Jay and Jim of Worland and two brothers, Rick of Phoenix and C.N. "Rube" Hillhouse of Worland.

Viewing is scheduled from 7 to 9 p.m. today in the Veile Mortuary. The service is scheduled for 1:30 p.m. Wednesday in the United Methodist Church in Ten Sleep with the Rev. Tim Walmer officiating. Burial will be in Ten Sleep Cemetery.
