Funeral services for Mrs. Eva B. Jones who died Thursday at her home in Ten Sleep following a long illness will be held at 2:30 p. m., Monday in Ten Sleep at the Methodist church. The Velle mortuary is in charge of arrangements.

Mrs. Jones, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Benjamin L. Bader, was born in 1866 in Lamona, Wis. She attended schools in Sparta, Wis., and Dorsey, Neb., in the western frontier days. She was married to Charles M. Jones at O'Neill, Neb., in 1889 and together they came to Wyoming in 1891 in a covered wagon over the Big Horn mountains to the French place above Ten Sleep.

Mrs. Jones visited in Nebraska in 1892 for a year and half, and after returning to Wyoming the family homesteaded the present Charles Duncan place on Nowood. The family moved to Basin in 1902 where the children attended school and remained there until 1911. Jones was one of the first school teachers in the Big Horn basin.

In 1911 the family returned to Ten Sleep where Mrs. Jones had lived ever since. Jones died Dec. 2, 1944, in a Kansas City, Mo., hospital.

Mrs. Jones is survived by six children: Mrs. Frank Bull of Ten Sleep, Mrs. Arnold Walsh of Buffalo, Mrs. Jake Goodrich of Buffalo, Tommy Jones of Hyattsville, Charles Jones of Lander and William Jones of Ten Sleep; one sister, Mrs. M. M. Emery of Hartford, Wash.; six brothers: John Bader of Sioux City, Iowa, Arch Bader of Lyatic, Mike Bader of Worland, Ben Bader of Worland, Fred Bader of Ten Sleep and Meriton Bader of Ten Sleep; 13 grandchildren, Mrs. A. L. Buchanan of Lovell, Marian, Elaine, Billy, Bess and Norma Bull, Beth and Lavonne Walsh and Kay, Wanda, Audrey, Hal and Norma Goodrich; and one great granddaughter, Mattie Buchanan.

She was preceded in death by her husband; one son, Lloyd, who died in 1903 at thirty; and one son, William Bader. Elaine Bull, who has been attending the University of Washington, will arrive Sunday for the funeral.
