WORLAND — Mildred Jones, 85, of Worland, died Friday, Dec. 25, in Bethesda Care Center.

She was born Feb. 9, 1907, in Lincoln, Neb., a daughter of Alfred and Ruth (Patterson) Eastman. She was raised in Nebraska and South Dakota. She attended high school and one year of college in Spearfish, S.D.

In 1935, she moved to Worland where she worked as a waitress at the Worland Cafe, the Hotel Washakie and Cream of the Valley Cafe.

On Aug. 6, 1937, she married Thomas L. Jones in Red Lodge, Mont.

Mrs. Jones was a member of the First Presbyterian Church where she had been a deaconess and a ruling elder. She also was a long-time volunteer for the Washakie Memorial Hospital Auxiliary.

Survivors include one half-brother, Glen Kresha of Sonoma, Calif.; one half-sister, Mrs. Alice Frisbie of

Lawton, Okla.; one nephew, Cecil Mullins of Manderson and one niece, Charlotte Luhring of Casper. She was preceded in death by her husband in 1965, her parents and one sister.

The service is scheduled for 1 p.m. Thursday in the First Presbyterian Church, with the Rev. Bill Foster officiating. Her body has been donated to the University of Utah Medical Center. The ashes will be buried in Ten Sleep at a later date.
