## Government Trapper's Body Is Discovered

BASIN — A government trapper, Albert Kirkpatrick, about 50, Basin, was found dead at 10:30 a.m. Tuesday 25 miles southwest of Basin on Five-Mile creek. Death was probably caused by a heart attack.

Kirkpatrick had started for his trap line Monday and his truck became stuck, according to the Atwood funeral home in Basin. It evidently took him some time and hard labor to free the vehicle before continuing to his trap line. The funeral home personnel said the apparent heart attack hit sometime after he freed the pickup.

The body was discovered by John Bullinger and Ren Yorgason, both of near Otto, and Bud Cropsey and Buck Caldwell, both of Greybull.

No arrangements have been made for the funeral.
