Mrs. Amanda Lehman passed away at her home on Coburn ave., on Sunday being 85 years of age.

Mrs. Lehman was well known in Worland having lived here for about seventeen years and until a few years ago worked as a practical nurse.

Amanda Lehman was born in Winnesheik County, Wisconsin on July 25, 1849, sometime later her parents moved to Iowa, later she went to California and in 1877 she was united in marriage with Joseph Lehman, one son James was born to this union, he died in 1916 in San Francisco.

Mrs. Lehman spent some time in Dakota but went back to San Francisco and was there during the earthquake and fire in 1906. She came to Wyoming in 1916 coming first to Thermopolis and a little later to Worland.

She is survived by two grandchildren Bertha and Gladys Lehman of San Francisco, one sister Mrs. Della Whitmore of Butte Montana and one brother Jake Helmer of Cersco, Iowa.

Mrs. Jas. Caley, a niece of Mrs. Lehman's and whom she cared for after the death of her mother ar

rived last Wednesday and was with her at the time of her death. Also Bush Helmer a nephew from the Ten Sleep country.

Funeral services were held in Ten Sleep on Tuesday afternoon after which she was laid to rest beside her brothers.
