TEN SLEEP --- Longtime Ten Sleep resident Gilbert W. "Gilligan" Pearl, 75, died on Sunday, June 22 at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Sheridan.

He was born on Oct. 7, 1921 in Santa Rosa, Mo., a son of Charles and Bessie (Yocum) Pearl. He lived in Missouri until moving to Ten Sleep in 1933, where he attended school.

Mr. Pearl was a member of The American Legion, the VFW, and the Disabled American Veterans.

His hobbies included hunting, fishing, horses, reading, and visiting with friends.

He is survived by his wife of Ten Sleep; two sons, Frank Pearl of Worland and Robert Pearl of Phoenix, Ariz.; four daughters, Karen Wilson of Casper, Martha Hinton of Lovell, Bessie K. Pearl of Worland, and Leann Pearl of Billings, Mont.; a brother, Charles J. Pearl of Basin; three sisters, Jerry Burton of Worland, Maxine Cooper of Ten Sleep and Virginia Black of Ennis, Mont.; seven stepchildren, 11 grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents.

The memorial service is scheduled for 10 a.m. Thursday at Veile Mortuary Chapel in Worland.

Cremation will take place, and the ashes will be buried at 11:30 a.m. Thursday at the Ten Sleep Cemetery, with members of the American Legion and VFW posts providing graveside military honors.
