**MOTHER OF LEO
RHODES DIES
IN BILLINGS**

TEN SLEEP —(Special)— Mrs. T. S. Rhodes, mother of County Commissioner Leo Rhodes, died at the Deaconess hospital at Billings Sunday afternoon. Her sons, Maben Rhodes of Manderson and Leo Rhodes of Ten Sleep, and her husband were with her.

Another son, Arthur, and a grandson, Willard, whom they reared, live in San Francisco, Cal., and funeral arrangements are indefinite pending their arrival. She is also survived by a daughter, Mrs. I. F. Holland of Los Angeles.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday at her home in Park City, Mont., and burial and graveside services will be held at Ten Sleep Thursday at 2:30 p. m.

**Last Rites Held

TEN SLEEP —(Special)— Funeral services were held for Mrs. T. S. Rhodes, 80, former Wyoming resident who died at Billings Sunday, at the home of her son, Leo Rhodes, Thursday afternoon.

The Rev. H. H. Bailey, pastor of the Worland Baptist church, conducted the service. A quartet composed of Mrs. Roy Shriver, Mrs. Glen Montgomery, Mrs. Dave Egbert and Mrs. Sam McPike sang "Beautiful Isle of Somewhere" and "Saved by Grace."

Pallbearers were Paul Frison, Charles Ford, E. S. Rice, O. B. Nowells, Archie Jacobs and F. L. Mills. Interment was in the Ten Sleep cemetery under the direction of the Veile mortuary.

Funeral services also were held at her home in Park City, Mont., Wednesday.

Marietta Allen, daughter of Robert and Nancy Allen, was born March 23, 1862 at Ravenwood, Nodaway county, Mo. She spent her early girlhood in Nodaway county, excepting a short time spent in Illinois.

On March 3, 1889, she was married to Thomas Sherman Rhodes. To this union five children were born, Leo D. of Ten Sleep, Orah Holland of Burbank, Cal., Arthur P. of Vallejo, Cal., and Mayben A. of Worland. One daughter, Alma Clair, preceeded her mother in death Feb. 2, 1920. She took a motherless niece in 1911 at the age of nine and was a mother to her. She is Jeanette Bieler of Colorado Springs, Colo. When her daughter passed away, she took the young grandson, then 21 months old, and raised him to manhood. He is Willard A. Lee of Richmond, Cal.

Mr. and Mrs. Rhodes spent their early married life in Missouri, later moving to Kansas in 1909, then to Wyoming and to Montana in 1919. They moved to Park City in 1923 and spent 19 years there.

Mrs. Rhodes united with the Methodist church in her early teens and remained a faithful Christian. She was a devoted wife and mother, giving her all to her home and family. Her health had not been good for several years.
