**Geo. Sutherland, Old
Timer Dies at Thermop**

George A. Sutherland, Ten Sleep stockman and rancher passed away at Thermopolis Monday night, December 24. For some weeks Mr. Sutherland had been in failing health and had gone to Thermopolis in an effort to obtain relief but his advanced years proved a handicap and death came.

Funeral services were held at Ten Sleep Wednesday afternoon and burial took place at the Ten Sleep Cemetery.

The deceased was born in January 1866 in Canada and was the son of William and Mary Sutherland. In 1873 the family moved to Chicago, Illinois and later to North Platte, Nebraska. Here George obtained his education and at the age of seventeen came to Buffalo, Wyoming where he was employed as a cowboy until 1892 when he came over the Big Horns to Ten Sleep. Here he purchased a partly improve ranch which he brought to a high stage of development.

January 1, 1895 he was married to Miss Fannie Warner. To this union were born five children, four sons and one daughter. He is survived by his widow and four children, Gordon, Dean, Ross and Margaret, another son, Clinton having preceded his father in death.

Mr. Sutherland was a true pioneer and his efforts in the up building of this section of the state will long be felt. He was an honorable man, a true neighbor and a good citizen.
