**Mark West Dies
Of Heart Attack**

Mark West, about 45, died at the Billy Waldo ranch yesterday afternoon, apparently the victim of a heart attack, while sitting in a chair.

The Waldo ranch is located in the Big Trails country near Ten Sleep. Arnold Veile of the Veile mortuary went to the ranch late last night to bring the body to Worland.

Funeral services for Mark West, who died Wednesday at the Billy Waldo ranch, will be held tomorrow at 2 p. m. at the Methodist church in Ten Sleep, the Rev. R. F. Goff officiating. Burial will be in the Ten Sleep cemetery.

A brother, A. J. West of Galesburg, Ill., will arrive in Worland today for the services. The Veile mortuary is in charge of arrangements.

West had lived in the Big Horn basin for more than 30 years as a stockman. He was born at Pleasant Hill, Pa., April 22, 1898.
