BUFFALO --- Bertha L. Lewis, 82, of Buffalo, died Saturday, March 26, in Deaconess Hospital in Billings.

She was born Oct. 22, 1911, in Hyattville, a daughter of Oscar and Tola (Cowlthorp) Hoback. As a small child, she moved with her family to Ten Sleep and later to Worland.

In 1920, the family moved to Manderson where she attended schools.

On Dec. 24, 1928, she married Roy O. Lewis in Worland.

Following their marriage, they lived on the Lower Nowood near Ten Sleep where they ranched. After selling the ranch, they moved to Worland, Shell, then to Buffalo in 1978.

Mrs. Lewis was active in the Friendly Circle Club while living in Ten Sleep and was a member of the Ten Sleep Methodist Church. Her hobbies included music, needle-work, for which she won several blue ribbons at the Wyoming State Fair, gardening and playing cards.

Survivors include two sons, Jerry of Basin and Jack of Douglas; two daughters, Bernadine Tolman of Kaycee and Jeanie Sinn of Worland; one sister, Mary Denny Roy of Thermopolis; 15 grandchildren and 27 great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband in 1981; one son, her parents, one grandson and three brothers.

The service is scheduled for 10 a.m. Friday in the Ten Sleep Methodist Church, with the Rev. Tyler Curtis officiating. The casket will be open at the church from 8 a.m. until service time. Burial will be in Ten Sleep Cemetery.
