WORLAND -- Clair Stubbs Lyman, 90, died Thursday, November 16, 2000, at Washakie Medical Center.

Clair was born on June 19, 1910 at Parawan, Utah, the son of Clark W. and Maude A. (Stubbs) Lyman. At the age of nine, the family moved to Cowley for a short time; then moved to Otto, where he received his education.

He was married to Mildred M. Riley on June 7, 1932, in Red Lodge, Mont. They made their home in Otto, where they worked for the Lincoln Land Company. In 1936, they purchased a farm east of Otto.

In 1941, the family moved to Ten Sleep, where they purchased the Bob Gordon ranch. Later they purchased the Bay State Ranch east of Ten Sleep and other properties in the area. Clair loved hard work and time on the ranch.

Clair and Mildred were sealed in the Salt Lake City LDS Temple on Oct. 3, 1957, along with their family. In 1985, he and Mildred moved to Worland, where he has resided until the time of his death.

Clair loved reading and reciting poetry. He was the first branch president of the LDS Church in Ten Sleep and served on the Big Horn Stake High Counsel.

He and Mildred also served a mission for the church in the Taos, N.M. area. He served on the Ten Sleep School Board and was a past member of the Woolgrowers Association and the Stockgrowers Association.

He was preceded in death by his parents; two sons, Paul and Barton; four brothers, Scott, Gene, Boyd, and Jack; and four sisters, Belle, Barbara, Vera, and Una.

He is survived by his wife, Mildred; two sons, Phillip (Joy) and Dale (Judy) all of Ten Sleep; daughter Kay (Bob) Swander of Cody; brother, Wayne (Margey) of Bakersfield, Calif.; 27 grandchildren; and 25 great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be Tuesday, Nov. 21 at 10 a.m. at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints Church in Worland with Bishop Michael Snyder officiating.

Burial will follow in the Ten Sleep Cemetery.

Visitation for family and friends will be at the Bryant Funeral Home Chapel on Monday evening, Nov. 20 from 6:00 to 7:00, and again on Tuesday at the church from 9 a.m. until service time.
