In 1908, she married W. W. Williams and to this union were born four boys. William L. Williams, Deceased, Carl M. Williams, of Ten Sleep, Alvin R. Williams, recently discharged from the armed services, and now a patient in the veteran's hospital at Cheyenne, Wyo., and Lyle L. Williams, killed in a plane crash in England Sept. 2, 1942.
