

**Eva Waln (1866-1907)**

Basin Republican no. 44 March 15, 1907, page 1: One of Big Horn County's Most Estimable Ladies, and a Pioneer, Dead. Mrs. Eva C. Waln, wife of R. A. Waln, of Spring Creek, passed away on Sunday March 10th, and the remains were laid to rest on Monday after fitting tribute paid to the memory of the noble woman by sorrowing friends, neighbors and relatives of the deceased, the funeral services being conducted by Rev. Toland and a large concourse of sorrowing ones following the body to its last resting place. Mrs. Waln was born in 1866 in Iowa, and in 1887, immediately after her marriage, she in company with her husband moved to this state where they have since resided. She was the mother of seven children, the eldest of whom, Grace, preceded her to the great beyond, leaving six children, the eldest 19 years of age, and a husband to mourn her untimely death. Mrs. Waln was a lady possessing a large circle of warm friends attracted to her by the many noble qualities of womanhood.
