BEAR RIVER CITY, Utah E. Ione Egbert Duncan, 79, of Bear River City was peacefully called home by her Heavenly Father, Wednesday, Oct. 13, 1999, to be greeted by her father, mother, sisters, daughter, and great-grandson.
